## CLASS GIFT

Our Class is making \$15,000 in new gifts in honor of our 30th Reunion.

The Class Gift Fund was created in 1974, with class members making voluntary contributions with their dues payments which are separate from annual contributions to the Cornell Fund. Through the years, the Class has funded a several worthwhile projects including campus beautification projects, a lecture series on campus, a book program for the library, and the Class of 1962 Baseball Scoreboard.

One of our longest running programs has been associated with the Johnson Museum of Art, where the Class has funded a photography collection, which will be on display at Reunion. This year, the Class is making an additional \$5,000 gift to the Johnson Museum of Art. A committee of class officers is studying other gift opportunities for the Class. An additional \$10,000 will be committed to new projects, with details to be announced at Reunion.

## CLASS DUES FOR 1992

The Class supports itself through an annual dues solicitation. The Class of 1962 has one of the highest levels of participation among Cornell classes thanks to your continued support. ## REUNION CAMPAIGN SETS GOAL

The Class of 1962 set a new Cornell and national record when it raised over \$5.5 million for its 25th Reunion. With our 30th Reunion almost upon us, the Class is again targeting the Cornell 30th Reunion record set by 1961 this past year \$5.6 million. Just as importantly, we hope to have as many classmates as possible contribute at whatever level they feel is appropriate. This year, the Reunion campaign ties in with Cornell's major Capital Campaign of goal of raising \$1.25 billion by 1996 to position the University as a leading research

and teaching institution in the 21st century.

Under the leadership of Campaign Chair Neil Schilke, and the magnificent generosity of a number of classmates, class gifts totaled \$2.6 million by mid-January, with five months left in the campaign.

The Cornell Campaign gives each of us an opportunity to thank the University for what it has done for us personally, while contributing in a substantial way to the society in which we live. As in past campaigns, we invite and encourage all classmates to participate in this effort.
